



CATTLE VACCINATIONS - UPDATE



Effective vaccination protocols are becoming increasingly important as we push for lower levels of disease and antibiotic usage. They play a key role in reducing losses associated with death, abortions and sick animals as well as sub clinical disease. Whilst vaccines come at a cost, they are often a wise investment to limit the financial implications associated with disease outbreaks.



Cattle vaccine sales in the UK have grown by 18% between 2011-2022 with a particular increase in calf pneumonia (45%) and calf enteritis (37%) vaccine uptake (AHDB). Calf scour and pneumonia are often associated with high levels of mortality and morbidity so it is not surprising that an increasing number of farmers are seeing the cost benefit of vaccinating against these diseases.



For example; the average cost of a clinical case of pneumonia ranges from £30-80 per animal (higher if the animal dies). This figure doesn't include other hidden costs such as decreased daily live weight gain. The most commonly used pneumonia vaccine is an intranasal vaccine which provides rapid protection against viral causes of pneumonia for roughly 10 weeks. This comes at a cost of £8-10 per calf but can quickly pay for itself by reducing cases and severity of clinical and sub-clinical disease. It is important to note though, that vaccination is not a 'silver bullet' and good management practices are still paramount in controlling disease.

Vaccination Protocols

Every farm will have a different vaccination regime dependent on risk factors and attitudes to risk. Below is a table showing the most common diseases which are vaccinated against and the associated vaccination protocol (based on current datasheet recommendations). I have not included pneumonia vaccinations as these protocols tend to be very farm specific.

Disease	Brand Names	Primary course	Booster dose
Leptospirosis	Spirovac, Leptavoid H	Two doses, 4 weeks apart (pre breeding)	Annually
BVD	Bovilis BVD, Bovela	Bovela- single dose	Annually

IBR	Bovilis IBR marker live	Two doses, 6 months apart	Either 6 monthly or annually
Calf scour	Rotavec corona, Bovigen scour		One dose given 3-12 weeks pre-calving
Lungworm	Huskvac	Two doses, 4 weeks apart (pre turnout)	Not usually required
Clostridial (Blackleg)	Covexin 10, Bravoxin	Two doses, 4-6 weeks apart	Either 6 monthly or annually

- **Focus on getting the primary course correct** - this primes the immune system and ensures subsequent boosters maintain immunity effectively. Set reminders to order and administer second doses in a timely manner
- **Get timings correct** - vaccination regimes usually need to be completed at least two weeks before the risk period for the disease being vaccinated against e.g. pre turnout for lungworm
- **Review protocols with your vet** - many factors on farm can change so keep your vet informed to keep the herd protected
- **Keep good records** - make a note of which animals have been vaccinated so none slip through the net

Storage and Handling Tips

- **Plan your visit to pick up vaccines** - don't pick up first thing and leave them in a warm vehicle all day. Try to get them back to farm ASAP and into the fridge.
- **Invest in a cool bag** - useful to transport vaccines back to farm and keeping them cool during administration if they are going to be out the fridge for several hours
- **Check your fridge temperature** - place a temperature gauge inside your fridge to make sure it is the temperature it should be

Administration Tips

- **Check the datasheet** - check the correct dosage and administration route, calibrate vaccination guns
- **Select the correct needle length and size** - this will depend on route of administration and animal size
- **Change needles regularly** - blunt needles cause muscle damage, changing them frequently also decreases the risk of needle contamination
- **Never vaccinate a sick or injured animal** - these animals are very unlikely to mount a good immune response
